Administrative Matters

The SWAC approved the December minutes. O'Connor (chair) and Cox (vice-chair) were re-elected (motion, Dickson, second, Paul, unanimous vote).

Public Hearing on Draft Amendments to the Rate Structure

A public hearing on draft amendments to the stormwater rate structure has been set for January 21, 2020; the item has been referred to the Commission for comment. In September, the Board of Aldermen received a report and discussed the need to increase stormwater service delivery, and directed staff to draft recommended changes to the stormwater rate structure. A 20% increase to the Equivalent Residential Unit fee (from \$75/year to \$90/year) is proposed, along with a new residential tier (\$180/year) for residential properties with greater than 6000 square feet of impervious surface area. In brief, more funding is needed for: additional staffing; addressing the increase in the intensity and frequency of storm events; accelerating the implementation of infrastructure improvements; enhancing service delivery to the community; and responding to new and anticipated federal and state regulatory requirements. The Commission continued discussion regarding the draft rate structure amendments from the previous meeting, and provided a recommendation endorsing the recommended amendments.

Toms Creek Neighborhood Outreach

Staff reported on the status of the survey prepared by the Center for Neighborhood Technology, a nonprofit that the Town has contracted with to perform a pilot study in the watershed and provide recommendations that guide the development of a stormwater residential assistance program. The survey website was opened on 12/2, and will close on 1/12. Over 100 "hits" have been observed for the survey link. Staff are working with CNT to schedule a presentation for early February.

Staff Update

Staff provided an update on several current initiatives: a UNC intern who will be providing graphics and outreach material support; a stream clean up along the Roberson bike path being planned for early March; a new stormwater social media account; progress with the Public Works stream restoration project, Broad Street culvert replacement, and Lorraine Street residential elevations.
