



Flood Watch in effect Today

Valid 2 PM Wednesday, July 9th to 2 AM Thursday, July 10th



A **Flood Watch** is in effect today from 2 PM until 2 AM for the Piedmont and Sandhills



Excessive runoff may result in flooding of creeks, streams, and other low-lying and flood-prone areas. Locations that saw significant rainfall from Chantal will have a greater risk of additional flooding.



Monitor later forecasts and **be alert for possible Flood Warnings**. Be prepared to take action should flooding develop in flood-prone areas.



Total Rainfall through Wednesday Night

July 9, 2025
3:25 AM

Valid from 8 AM Wednesday until 8 AM Thursday



Most likely rainfall amounts range from 0.5 to 1.5 inches across the Piedmont.

Locally higher amounts of 2 to 5+ inches will be most possible anywhere within the **yellow outline**.

Higher amounts will likely be confined to concentrated areas rather than large areas like what was experienced on Sunday from Chantal.






Saturated Soils

July 9, 2025
3:25 AM

A product that estimates soil saturation based on prior rainfall.



The ground remains saturated from the heavy rain that fell on Sunday from Chantal.

Areas highlighted in **green** and **blue** are the locations where soils are especially sensitive to additional rainfall and would produce flash flooding conditions quicker than typical.

Urban and poor drainage areas will also be susceptible to flash flooding.








Excessive Rainfall through Friday

For all of Central NC



The risk for at least isolated instances of flash flooding will remain possible each day through Friday. The risk level is higher for today and Thursday when greater coverage and threat for isolated significant flash floods will be possible.






Severe Wind Gusts Possible This Afternoon/Evening

Level 2 Risk Central North Carolina




